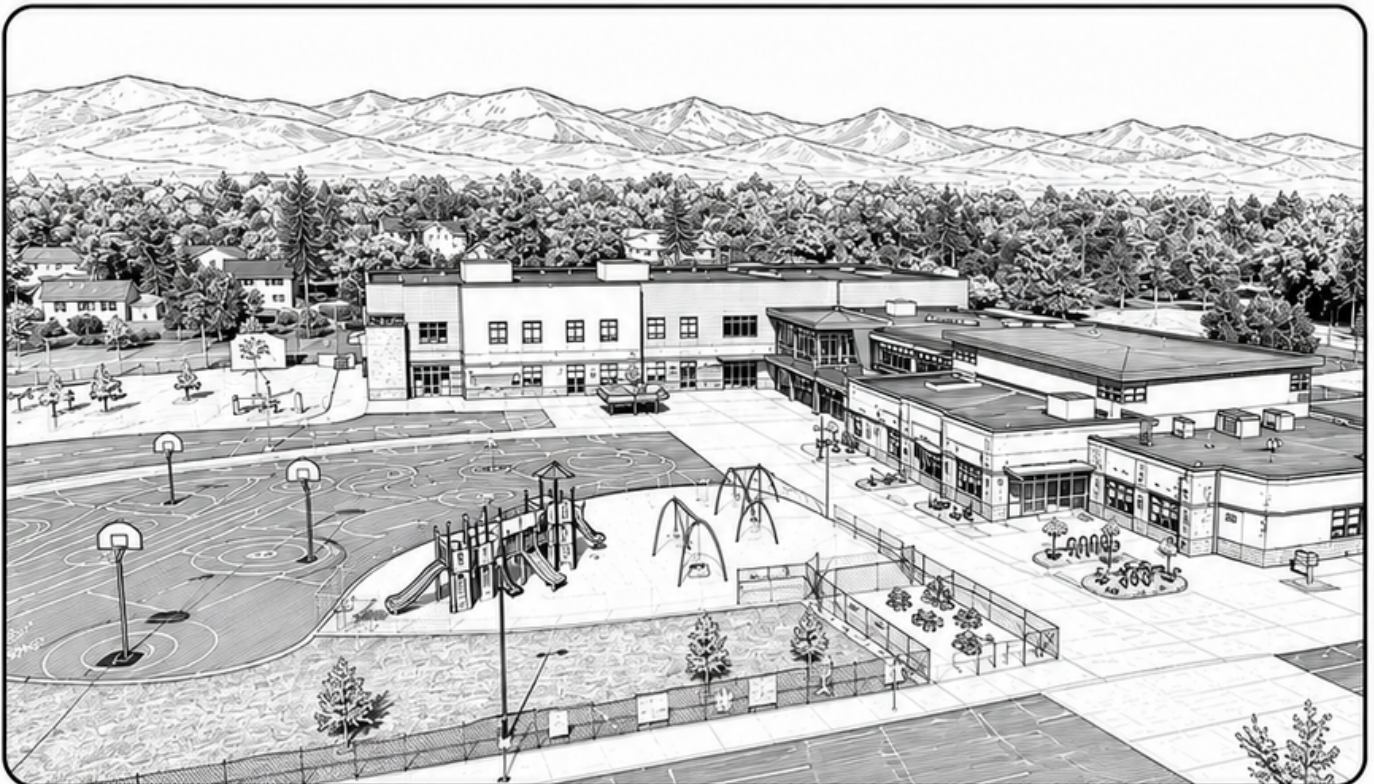

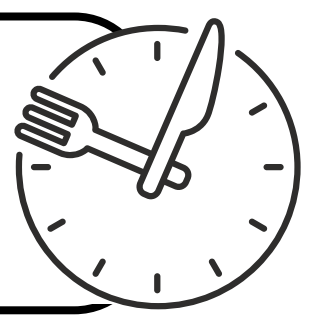

Breakfast Information:

Sierra offers free, optional breakfast in the cafeteria. To participate, see grade level instructions below. If adults choose to eat breakfast with students, they must sign in upon entering the cafeteria.

Students in K-5th grades

- Breakfast hours 7:20-7:35 am
- Please do not drop students off or come before 7:20 as there is no adult supervision outside.
- At 7:20, go to the exterior cafeteria doors (Kindergarten entrance). Students will enter the cafeteria on their own, go immediately to the service line to retrieve their meal, and sit at a table to eat. Supervision will be provided.
- Students will be dismissed to their classrooms at 7:35 am (once their spots are clean).

Students in Pre-K

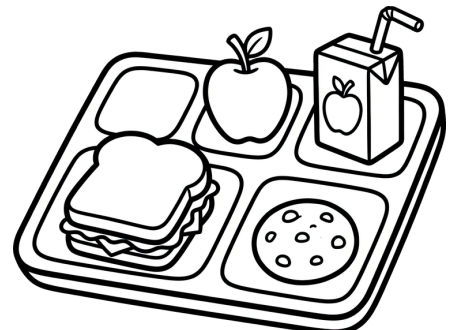
- Breakfast hours 7:20-7:55 am
- Pre-K students must be accompanied by an adult/family member who will remain with them during breakfast.
- At 7:55, adults and students will exit the cafeteria and go outside to their arrival door to sign students in for the day.

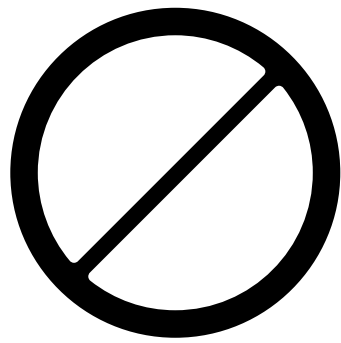
Joining your child for lunch:

Families are welcome to join students for lunch. This can be a special way to celebrate your child's birthday or just a random Tuesday. Adults must first sign in at the Front Office via Raptor (with a driver's license, government ID, or using the Raptor app).

Parents can bring a special meal for their child, but please do not share any food with other students (for a variety of reasons).

For safety reasons, families cannot join students during recess.

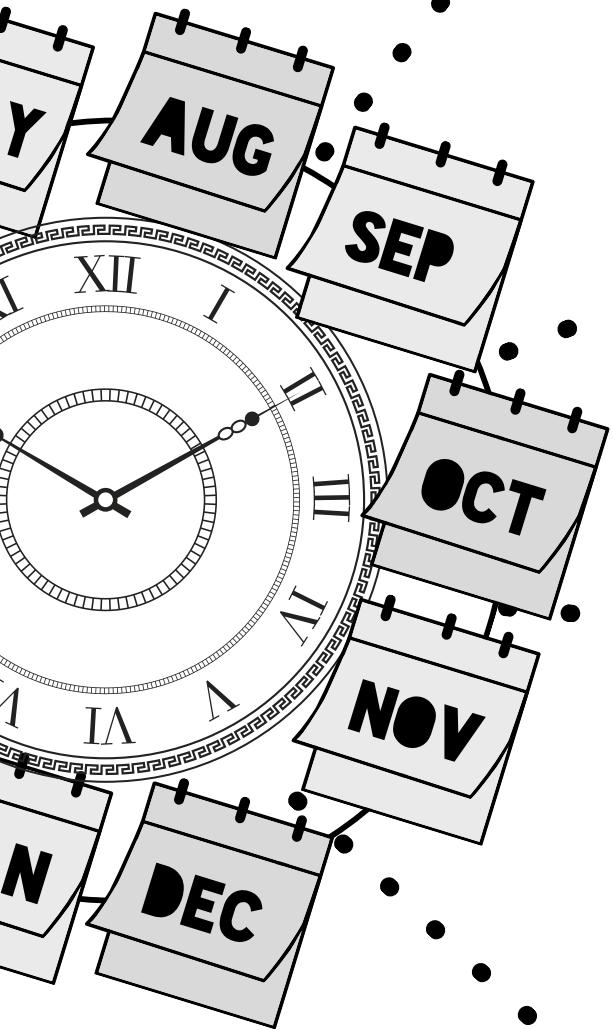

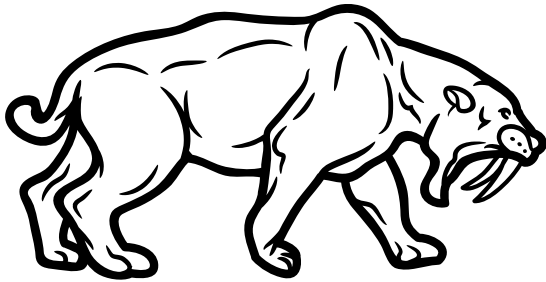

ROAR Days

What is a ROAR day?

Each month, our AMP team – Art, Music, and PE – celebrates ROAR behavior with a fun event in the gym. All three classes join together for dancing, singing, games, and themed activities. Each month has a unique theme, and students are encouraged to dress accordingly.* This energetic celebration reinforces the values Sierra Sabertooths ROAR: Safe, Respectful, and Responsible.



*Important Note:

Costumes are not required. Instead, students can wear something simple like a graphic t-shirt that fits the theme. For example, on Outer Space Day, students could wear shirts with stars, planets, aliens, NASA logos, or Star Wars graphics, instead of dressing as astronauts or Darth Vader. If your child doesn't have theme-related clothing, there's no need to buy anything new.

The focus is on creating joyful experiences and meaningful memories – not on what students wear.

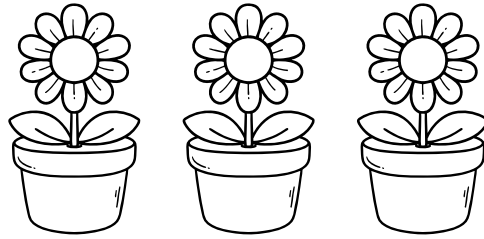

Grades 2-5: Tuesdays 2:35-4:05 pm

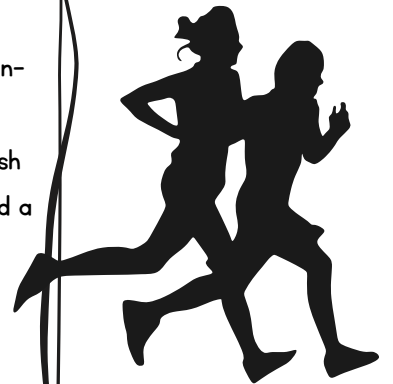

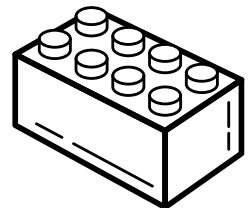
Spanish Club

PTA FAQs

Where do I order new spirit wear?

Orders for new Sierra Spirit Wear (t-shirts, sweatshirts, hats, etc) are coordinated once a year by the Sierra Office. Ordering information is sent out in the Sierra Scoop and via email. For the 26-27 school year, the order window closes on August 23, 2026.



Can I pass on my old spirit wear?

Yes! Donate used spirit wear to the Sierra PTA's Spirit Wear ReWear program! Simply bring in *clean* spirit wear items that you'd like to pass along and drop them in the ReWear box in the office vestibule. You can also grab something new from that same box during school hours or at community events.



How do I order a Yearbook?

The PTA works with Lifetouch to create our yearbook. Copies can be ordered on their website (<https://ybpay.lifetouch.com/>). Use the unique school code: 11780627 for Sierra. Ordering dates and deadlines will be announced in the Sierra Scoop and Friday Folders. The order deadline is typically sometime in early April. Contact the Yearbook team with any questions - yearbook@sierraptaarvada.org.

Can I submit photos for the Yearbook?

Yes! We need your photos of first day of school, school events, etc to help make the yearbook amazing! The photo submission process is easy, simply fill out this form: <https://bit.ly/Sierra-Photos2627>. We recommend submitting photos throughout the year. Please only submit photos that are school related.

How can I support Sierra if I have limited time and resources?

Not all volunteering requires a lot of time! Some jobs don't take long, and have a big impact. Being a crossing guard only takes about 15 minutes, but increases student safety during drop-off and pick-up. Parent helpers during classroom parties are vital for a successful party. See pages 24 and 25 for more information about volunteering at Sierra and watch the Sierra Scoop for upcoming volunteer needs. There are also easy fundraisers like collecting Longmont Dairy Milk Caps or enrolling in the King Soopers Community Rewards program (<https://www.kingsoopers.com/i/community/community-rewards>) that raise funds for Sierra while you buy your normal groceries.

Can I donate to the PTA without participating in a fundraiser?

We understand that fundraisers can be a lot of work for parents and some families would like to opt out. How should I pass out birthday party invitations?

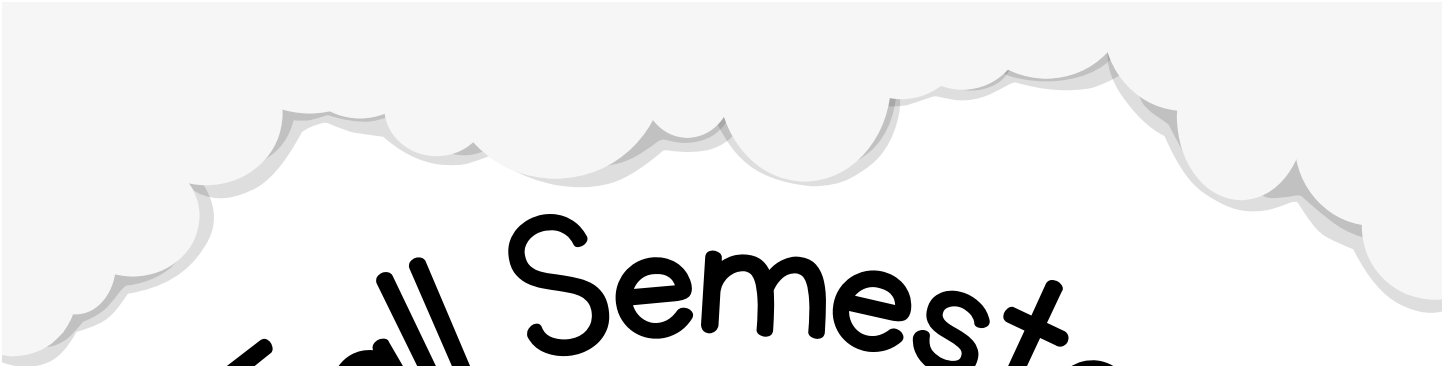
It is Sierra policy that party invitations cannot be distributed during the school day, through Friday Folders, school email, etc - even if the whole class is invited. So what can you do?

- You can use the Sierra Family Directory (organized by the PTA) to find parent contact information and send invites. The Sierra Family Directory is optional and the information is only shared with other families that have opted in. - You and your child can hand out invitations outside the building during drop-off and pick-up.

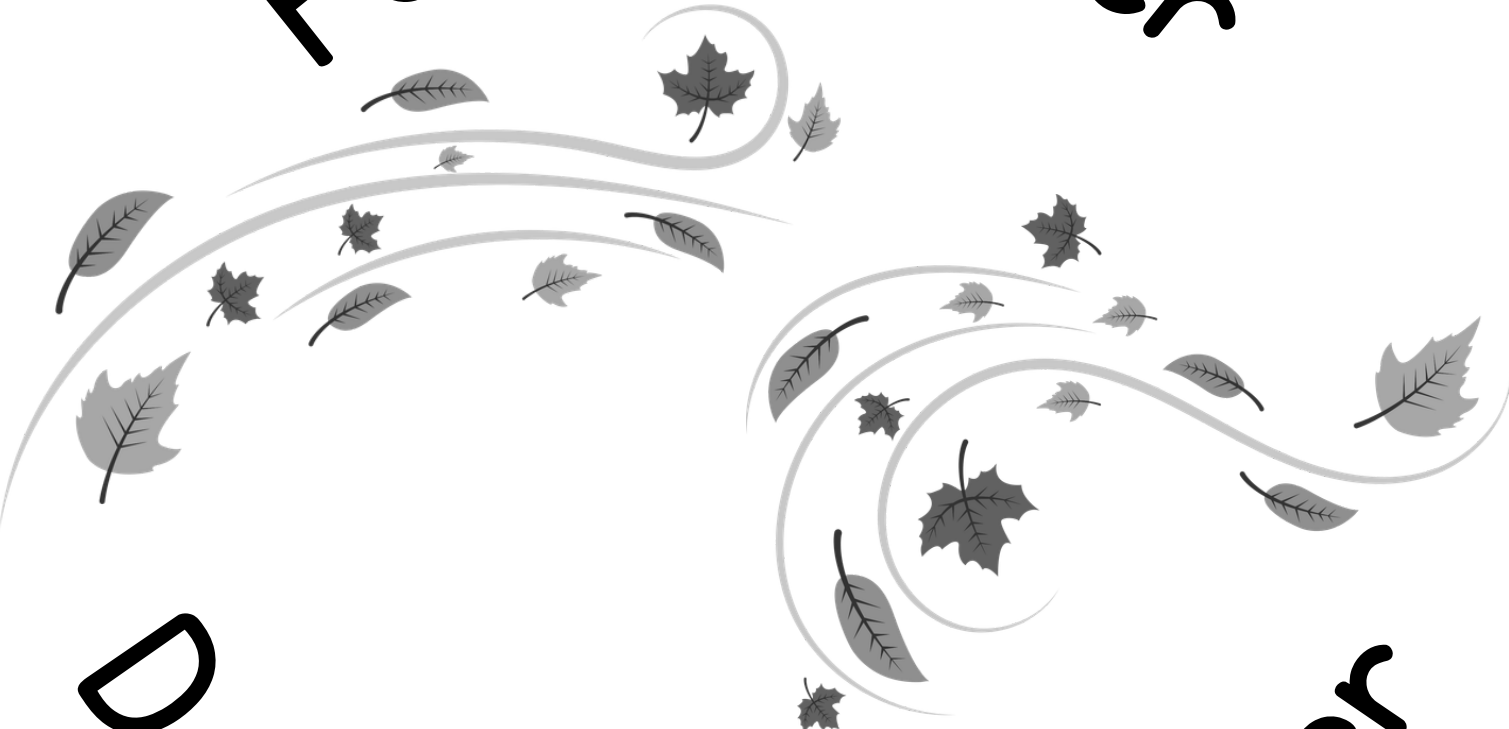

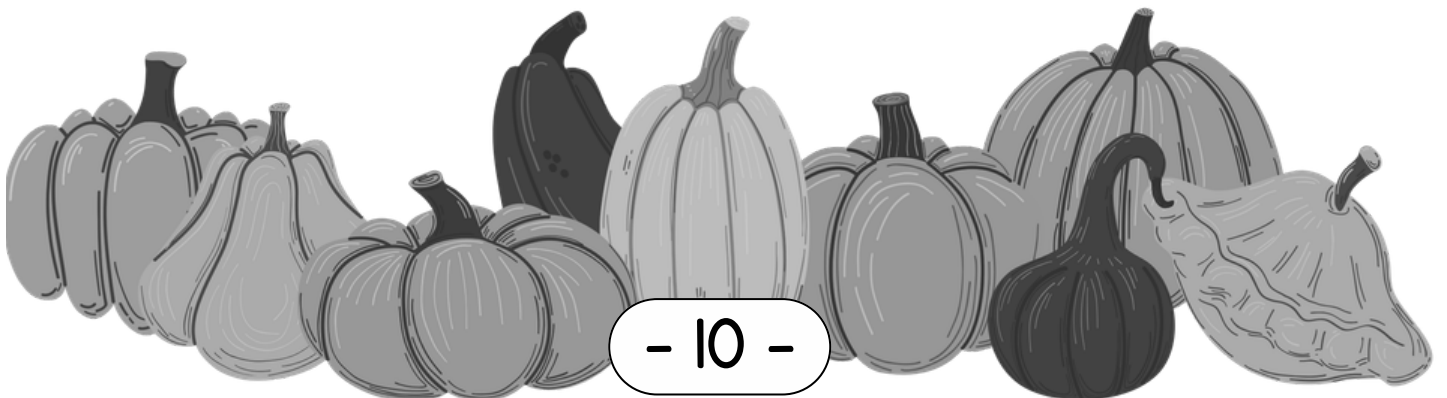

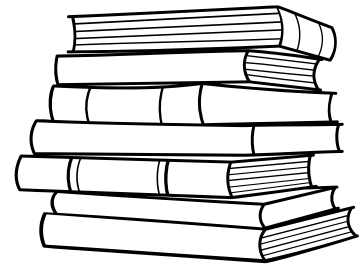
Teacher Meet & Greet: Monday, August 17

Come by the school to meet your teacher face to face. 1st - 5th grade families can drop off school supplies. If you purchased a school supply kit in the spring, it'll be waiting for you at school!

First Day of School: Wednesday, August 19

Back to School Night: Thursday, August 27

Meet your students' teachers and hear what they will be learning about this year. Teachers will provide a grade-level presentation with information about the teachers and what to expect throughout the year. Each grade will offer the presentation twice to accommodate families with multiple children at Sierra.

Literati Book Fair:

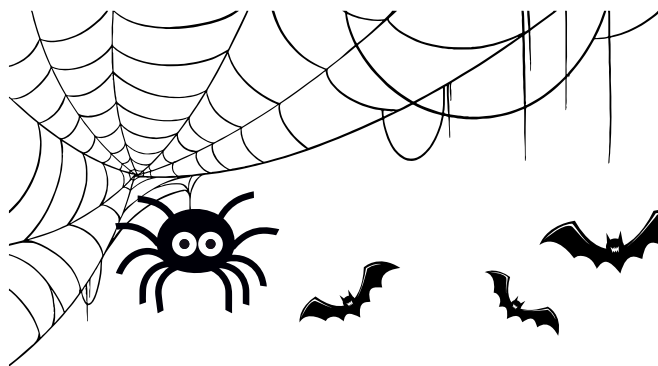
Friday, October 9 & Wednesday, October 14 - Friday, October 16

The library's biggest fundraiser of the year! The Book Fair brings in thousands of dollars to help support our library, book room, and technology budgets. Shopping hours will be all day and during conferences. Students may bring money to shop during specific times during the school day, OR parents can purchase gift cards through the Literati website to shop without worrying about cash and change. Parents can also come shop anytime during the day or after school. On conference nights, the Book Fair is open during the evening as well. Keep an eye out for volunteer sign-ups to help with set-up, cashier positions, and tear-down.

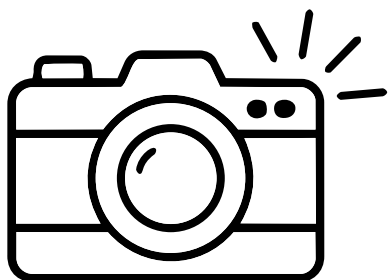
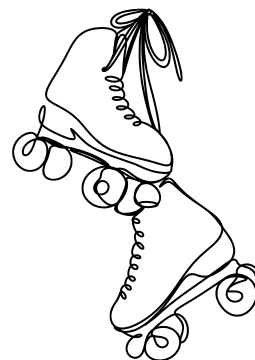

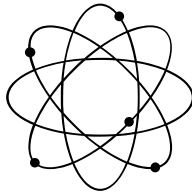
Sierra Skate Night at Skate City: Tuesday, November 10

Missed picture day or had a bad hair day? Just return your packet of pictures and your student can have their picture re-taken at no extra cost.

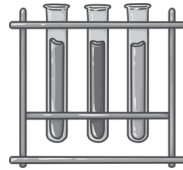


Science Fair: Thursday, November 12 and Friday, November 13

The Science Fair is optional for students in grades K-5. Students can work individually or in pairs, but all project work is done at home.

This is a fun opportunity to do science with your child and create a poster on a topic or experiment they enjoy. Entries can be experiments or demonstrations/simulations. Sierra's library has many science project books for inspiration, and the internet is another great resource.

Judging takes place during the school day, with volunteer judges reviewing posters and asking students about their experiments. Judging is divided into 3 age groups: K-1, 2-3, and 4-5. The top 3 winners in each category will receive prizes, while all participants get a t-shirt and Science Fair ribbon. Partner projects (max 2 students) are allowed, but must be within the same age group.

This testing is used to help determine big-picture academic goals for the following year, and to create targeted strategies for teaching and learning.

- This committee supports staff and teachers in creating bulletin boards for a variety of needs and topics as requested.

- This team oversees all aspects of the fundraiser: setting a day, coordinating race logistics, getting sponsors, providing race packets, and acquiring race wear for the day.

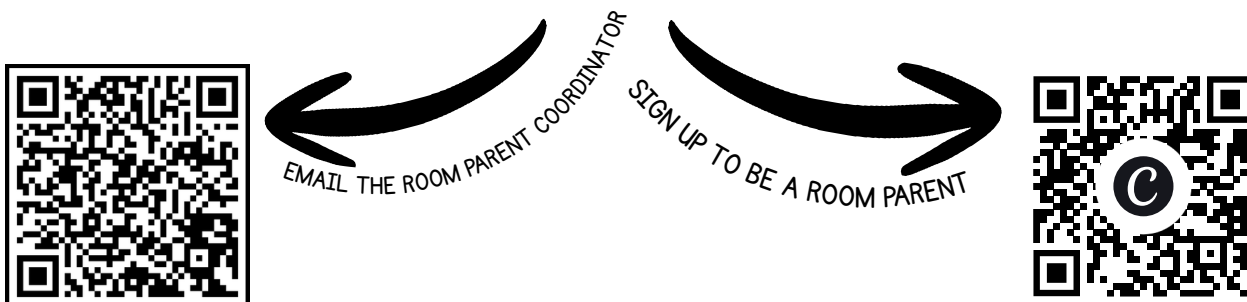

What does a Room Parent do?

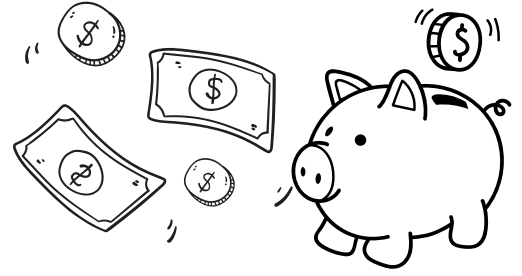

Fundraisers



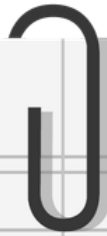
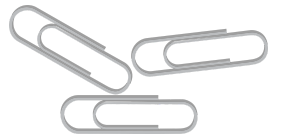
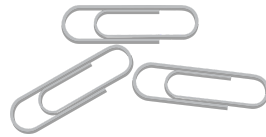
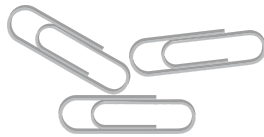
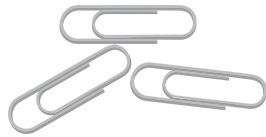
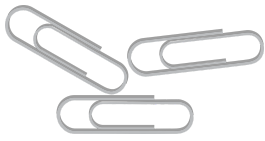
The PTA runs two major fundraisers each year, and supports smaller ways to help donate throughout the year. Our current fundraisers are the Strides for Sierra 5k in the fall, and the Read-a-thon in the spring. These two fundraisers bring in all the money the PTA needs to fund committees, purchase technology for the school, provide grants for teacher supplies, classroom enrichment and host our community events throughout the year.

There are also some everyday ways that you can raise money for the PTA and Sierra. Milk Caps for Moola is a program from Longmont Dairy where Sierra can earn 5 cents for every Longmont Dairy milk cap that you bring into school to be recycled. Save your milk caps and drop them in the collection box in office vestibule.

The King Soopers Community Reward program lets you contribute to Sierra PTA every time you buy groceries. Once you link your Shopper's Card to Sierra Elementary, King Soopers will give a percentage of every dollar you spend to the Sierra PTA.
